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

Enjoying an afternoon in our park helps bring us together as a community. If you missed this event, there will always be another Ranch community event coming soon.



Orange County Real Estate Update: Subdued Summer Market

- In Orange County, demand peaked at the start of May at 1,759 homes. Since then, it has dropped by 8% or 135 pending sales and sits at 1,624 today.
- House supply has grown by 23%, adding 582 homes, and sits at 3,052 today.
- The market has slowed considerably in the past couple of months. In fact, since May, the Expected Market Time has grown from 42 days to 56 days today.
- Overzealous sellers who stretch their asking price will not find success until they adjust their expectations. That is why 29% of the active inventory has reduced the asking price at least once.




