OC Real Estate Update: Lower Rates Resulted in A Jump in Demand

After topping 7.5% in April, mortgage rates have declined to the low sixes and have remained there with duration, paving the way for an uncharacteristic **late September rise in demand**.

Mortgage rates are currently at 6.21%. For a \$1 million home purchase with 20% down, the monthly payment would be \$4,905. That is much better than last year's 7.61% rate and monthly payment of \$5,654.

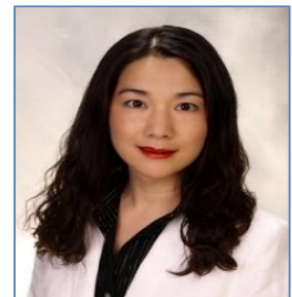
With a significant improvement in home affordability, buyer demand jumped from 1,413 two weeks ago to 1,554 days today, **up 141 pending sales or 10%**. It was the first late September rise in demand since 2012.

Combine the surge in demand with a slight drop in the inventory, down 1% in the past couple of weeks, and **the market is uncharacteristically heating up amid the Autumn Market**.

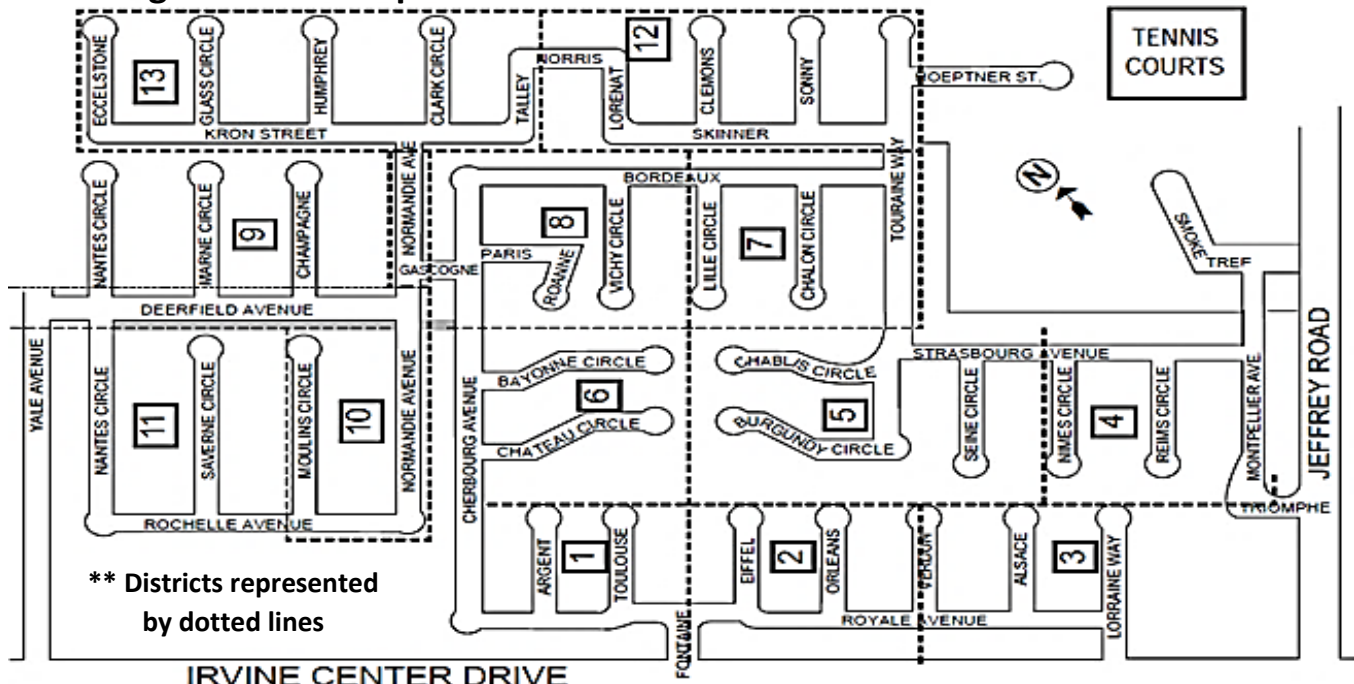

KEEP THE HOME FIRES BURNING – SAFELY – WITH THESE FIREPLACE SAFETY TIPS

On a cold winter night, a warm fire in the fireplace is just the thing to ward off the season's chill. Just be sure your fireplace is safe to use.

Whether you use a fireplace for heat or that cozy feeling, here are some tips to keep you and your home safe this winter, and to keep your fireplace burning brightly and safely.



Inside Your Home

- Remember to open the flue on the fireplace before starting the fire.
- If you burn wood, only burn dry, seasoned wood, not scrap wood, treated wood or trash.
- Create a three-foot "safety zone" that is free of flammable material around any fireplace.
- Extinguish the fire before going to bed or leaving the house.
- Don't close the damper until the embers have completely stopped burning.
- Make sure all vent pipes extend at least three feet above your roof.
- Always have working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in all levels of your home – especially sleeping areas.
- Equip the fireplace with a metal screen to catch burning embers or shifting logs.
- Never use a fireplace for grilling food or burning holiday wrappings.

- Never use flammable liquids to start a fire.
- If the fireplace is gas operated, be sure to move the gas valve to the "closed" position when you are not using it.

Outside Your Home

Take a few precautions so you can enjoy the warmth and coziness your fireplace brings.

- Protect the chimney top with a spark-arrester screen. This should help keep animals, rain, and other debris out and prevent embers from escaping and landing on nearby combustibles or landscaping, which could ignite. Also, trim any branches that may drop leaves or twigs into your chimney, creating a fire hazard.
- Inspect the chimney for cracks on an annual basis. If repairs are necessary, have them performed by a reputable contractor.
- Have the chimney flue cleaned annually by a professional. If you live in an apartment, consult with your building management to ensure this is done properly and regularly.

LANDSCAPING – Paula. The Fontaine & Royale small island plants have been removed and will be replaced soon.

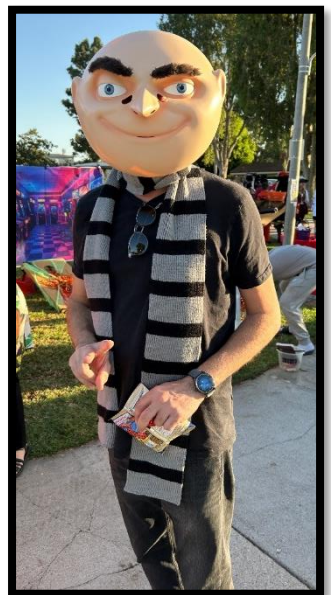
CPK FUNDRAISER – Linda. Successful event!

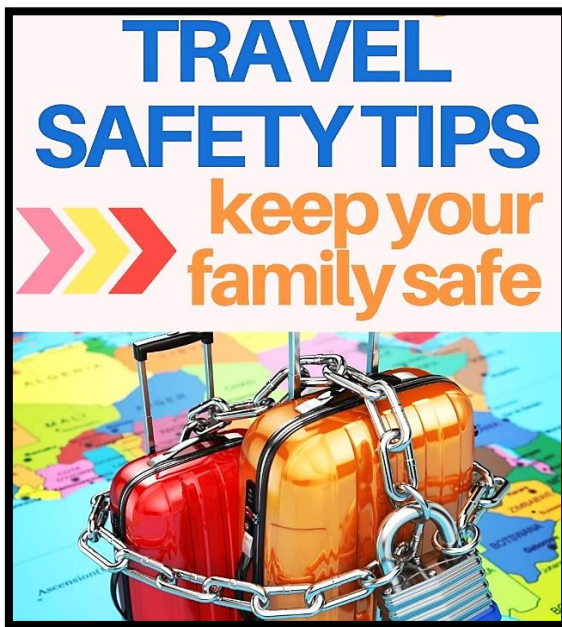

Many of us are getting ready to make plans for holiday travels. No matter how far you go, set up preventative measures to keep yourself and property safe. Here are some things you can do.

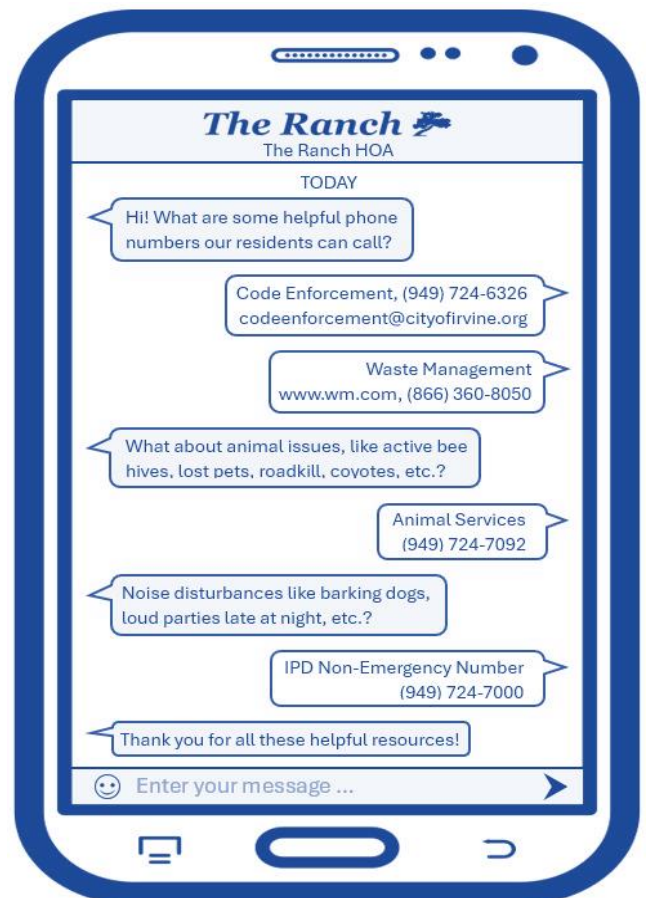
At home:

- Does your house look lived in?
- Lock your doors and windows; do not leave any doors open.
- If you have pets, will they be going with you? Or will they be under good care at home?
- Keep your valuables locked inside your home; do not leave valuables in your vehicles.
- Regularly inventory your personal belongings, include serial numbers and take photos.
- Check to ensure that your indoor and outdoor lighting and cameras are working.
- Consider installing timers on all of your lighting and security cameras.
- Do you have all of your bikes registered at project529.com/Irvine?
- Have you signed up for informed delivery at USPS.com to keep track of your mail?
- Have you reviewed your credit reports at Equifax, TransUnion and Experian?
- Are you tracking your expenses and getting notifications from your banks when you make purchases? These notifications can help with potential fraudulent transactions.

During travels:

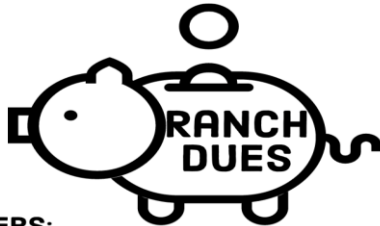
- Communicate with your loved ones so they know where you are going.
- Consider putting trackers inside luggage or expensive belongings when travelling.
- While shopping, keep your purse closed and in front of you, not in the cart.
- Be aware of quick-change artists during cash transactions.
- Be aware of strangers offering gifts or touching your belongings.
- Only take what you need with you – leaving valuables and jewelry at home.
- Pay attention to your surroundings.
- Greet people as you see them, but also think about how you would describe them if needed in an emergency.
- Resist the urge to post on social media that you are out of town; save those wonderful photos for when you return.
