## RHOA PRESIDENT'S LETTER – JUNE 2025

We like to think about life in our Ranch community being about neighbors, families, our children's events, but lately many other things are happening in and around our community in which we need to be aware and cause us to be concerned.



### CRIME

We live in Irvine and are told this is one of the safest cities in America, but crime still happens around us. And yes, it does happen in The Ranch. This past month we have had a few incidents of police activity within The Ranch. We have had a vehicle stolen, investigations, arrests, and very concerned neighbors.

Please be aware of your surroundings and if you see something that seems odd or suspicious, contact the Irvine Police Department at 949 724-7000. If it is an emergency always call 911. Remember "*see something, say something*" and let the Irvine Police determine if it is something they need to investigate.

The Irvine Police Department suggested we re-ignite our Neighborhood Watch program. This program involves neighbors connecting with neighbors and will only work if individuals volunteer to become involved. If we get enough of a response, Irvine PD will help us organize. Please contact me or let any director know if you are interested.

### Irvine Company plans to REPLACE Oak Creek Golf Course with 3,100 homes.

As most of us know, the state of California has

mandated housing development to cities throughout the state and that Includes a mandate for Irvine. Several proposals and options have / are being presented, but this option is very close to The Ranch Community and could severely affect life in The Ranch. Most homes in The Ranch received a packet from the Irvine Company on your porch, in the mail, or both. You may be reading about this in the Register. This is not a done deal. I have spoken with many residents of The Ranch who are opposed to this redevelopment.

Several Ranch residents attended the City of Irvine Council Meeting on Tuesday, May 13th. Some of those who attended the meeting also spoke to the City Council expressing their opposition to this proposal. To oppose this project, the community must come together to be heard.

The Ranch Board of Directors is planning to hold an informational meeting about Oak Creek Golf Course redevelopment and how it may affect The Ranch. As soon as we have the details, we will send out an e-newsletter alert. So please, if you are not receiving our Ranch e-newsletter, contact me so we can add you to receive the most up-to-date information about The Ranch Community and upcoming news and events.

We will attempt to keep The Ranch residents informed, and I urge you to consider becoming a well-informed, involved Ranch resident and member of our HOA.

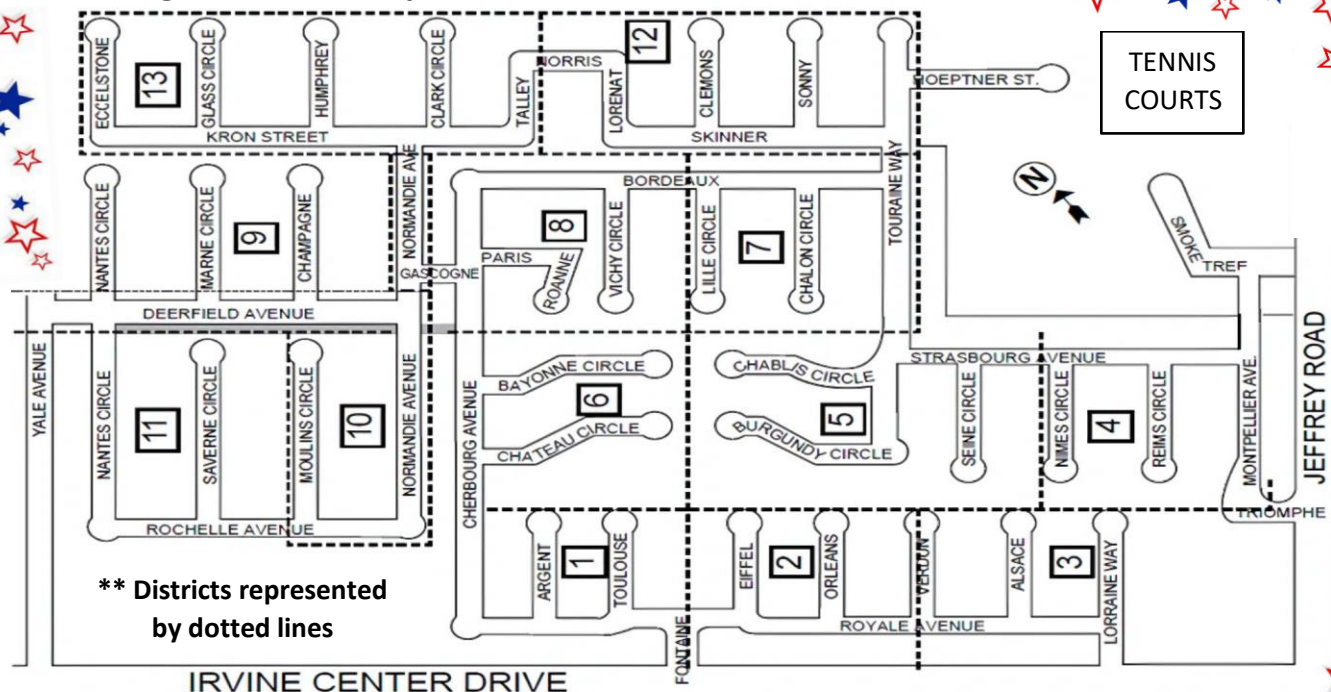

## FROM THE IRVINE POLICE: HIKING AND BIKING SAFETY IN IRVINE

Exploring Irvine's beautiful trails and bike paths are a fantastic way to enjoy the outdoors, but safety should always be a priority. Here are some essential tips to keep your adventures safe and enjoyable.



### General Safety Tips

- Always be aware of your surroundings and stay on designated trails.
- Trails are open from dawn to dusk.
- Carry a fully charged phone and let someone know your route.
- Bring enough water to stay hydrated, especially in warm weather.
- Wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the terrain.

### Hiking Safety

- Check trail conditions and weather forecasts before heading out.
- Carry a map or use GPS navigation to avoid getting lost.
- Watch out for wildlife and respect their habitat.
- Hike with a buddy whenever possible for added safety.

### Biking Safety

- Wear a helmet and other protective gear.
- Follow traffic rules and stay in designated bike lanes or trails.
- California Vehicle Code requires using lights and reflectors between dusk and dawn.
- Keep your bike well-maintained with regular checks on brakes, tires, and gears.

If you see something suspicious, including people on trails after hours, call the Irvine Police non-emergency line at 949-724-7000. In an emergency, call 911.

Enjoy your time outdoors while staying safe!

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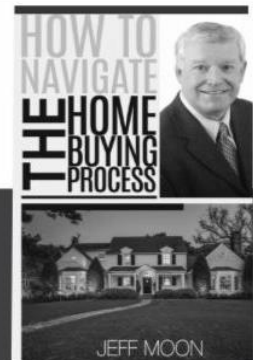
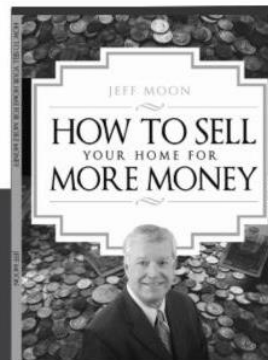

### UPDATE: IRVINE CITY LIBRARY

The target date for opening Heritage and University Park libraries in the new Irvine Library System has been delayed to at least August 4.

Currently a County library, The Katie Wheeler branch will close July 1, 2025 to finalize its transition to the City of Irvine, which anticipates re-opening the branch in early 2026.

Although no library facility will be open in Irvine between July 1 and August 4, your County library card works at any County library locations. The closest is in Tustin at 345 E Main Street.

## RANCH BEAUTIFICATION, 2025: Summer of Love (Your Neighborhood)

The weather has warmed up and we all seem to be out and about and ready to enjoy the beauty of The Ranch Community.

- The City of Irvine has work scheduled in The Ranch during the month of June. Landscaping crews will be working on Booth Circle easement behind the homes on Rochelle Avenue. They plan to take out four of the very large pine trees and then plant Water Gum trees with a spacing of approximately 30 feet. This should be happening around the fourth week of June.
- Our Park Improvement project appears to be scheduled to begin mid-June. This consists of an enlargement of our west picnic area including a shade cover. This shade cover has been much needed since the removal of so many of our very large original eucalyptus trees.

- Ongoing discussions with the City of Irvine public works department about our green belts have helped keep them looking healthy and maintained.
- We have received repeated complaints about unused cars stored on streets, excessive weeds, and trash containers left on the streets for extended periods of time. These are City of Irvine code violations. If this applies to you, we hope you will be able to remedy this before the City of Irvine pays you a visit.

We hope you will join us in the coming months for a wonderful summer enjoying our Ranch Community.

### City of Irvine Municipal Codes

#### Did You Know . . .

#### Sec. 3-35-2. - Wall and fence requirements.

A. *Wall and fence heights.* The maximum heights for fences or walls are listed below.

No wall or fence shall obstruct visibility for access, as determined by Standard Plan 403.

1. *Residential and institutional uses.*
  - a. *Front.* Fences and walls in the front setback area shall be no higher than two and one-half feet above grade at the property line. The fence or wall may be one foot higher for every three feet the fence or wall is set back from the property line, up to a maximum of seven feet above grade.
  - b. *Streetside.* Fences and walls in the streetside setback area shall meet the requirements in Section 3-35-2.A.1.a above unless there is no vehicular access (driveway) from the streetside. In this case, the height of the fence or wall may be seven feet above grade.

## *What is Neighborhood Watch?*

A Neighborhood Watch program is a group of people living in the same area who want to keep their neighborhood safe by working together with local law enforcement to reduce crime and sustain neighborhood quality of life. The program provides residents with crime prevention strategies and information to help them identify and report potential criminal activity in their neighborhoods. Neighborhood Watch groups focus on observation and awareness while promoting social interaction and watching out for each other.

Neighborhood Watch brings an extra layer of safety to the neighborhood. The communication between residents and the police department's assistance with crime prevention information will help to reduce crime and increase quality of life. The increased communication provides a sense of security and improves neighborhood engagement so that residents feel a sense of connection and involvement.

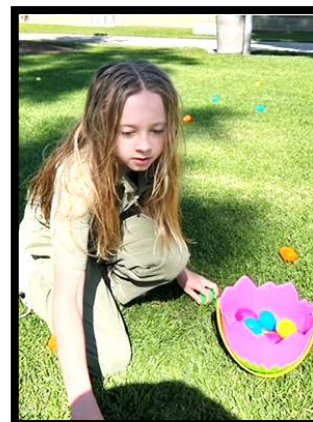
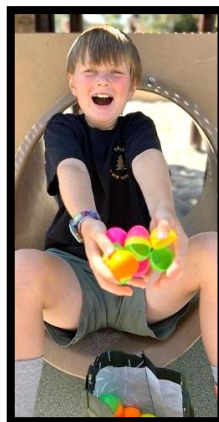

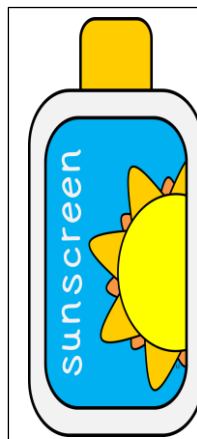
