Happy New Year to our Ranch Neighbors!

As we welcome 2026, many of us have made New Year Resolutions or at least set a few goals to accomplish as the new year begins. The RHOA Board of Directors, like many of you, have been working on resolutions and goals for our Ranch community.



We would certainly like to see **more residents become members of The Ranch HOA**. Our HOA is unique within the City of Irvine. It is not mandatory for you to join our community HOA, but it is a privilege and honor to support our Ranch community of neighbors. Nowhere in Irvine does any HOA give back to their community as much as The Ranch HOA, for such a small commitment. With your support of only \$50 a year, we provide each Ranch household with wonderful and informative newsletters, The Ranch Roundup. We bring the community together with activities for children, adults, and families. Our HOA Board is committed to providing services needed such as Dumpster Days. And we try our best to voice our neighborhood concerns to the Irvine City Council.

Another goal of the RHOA Board is to **spend RHOA funds wisely**. In 2025 we did need to raise our modest dues, but we also were able to cut our expenses. These two actions combined allowed us to offer a new adult activity – Adult Egg Frenzy and purchase a new large shade canopy to use at events. In 2026 we plan to continue this effort and have added a few more activities, both for adults and families.

Bringing our community together is an ongoing goal. We have always focused on community in providing events such as our 4th of

July Celebration, Eggstravaganza, and Trunk or Treat. In 2026 we hope to continue that commitment by incorporating “Love Your Neighborhood” (a district focused event), “Sunset Serenade” (music in the park), and “Ranch Readers” (a new book club group).

Representing The Ranch to our Irvine City Council is a continued priority. We will continue to promote improvements within our neighborhood, such as our remodeled picnic area and shade sails. It is important that we maintain conversations with city staff in keeping The Ranch maintained and updated to current city standards in order to maintain property values within our Ranch community.

Even though the RHOA Board sets these goals, we cannot accomplish any of this without continued support from our community. We need you to support our efforts by paying our modest membership dues, volunteering to help plan events, and volunteering to serve on committees and at events.





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OAK CREEK PRESERVATION AREA

For our Ranch residents who are following The Irvine Company's plans for redevelopment of Oak Creek Preservation Area, I would like to share with you the 2025 End-of-Year Message from "Save Irvine Open Space".

As most Ranch residents are aware, The RHOA board supports the efforts of "Save Irvine Open Space" and the opposition of the proposed development of **3,100 homes** on the 196 acres of Oak Creek Preservation Area.

"As we close out 2025, we want to take a moment to thank everyone in our community who has supported Save Irvine Open Space – whether through your time, your voice, or your donations. Your involvement truly matters.

This year brought an important community win – The Irvine Company appears to have stepped back from its most aggressive plan to redevelop the Oak Creek Central City open space and has expressed willingness to build a public park. That shift happened because residents paid attention, spoke up, and demanded transparency.

However, significant concerns remain. Despite these changes, they still seek to develop approximately 100-125 acres of open space.

The current proposal still seeks to redevelop areas covered by voter-approved open space preservation and would violate the spirit and intent of Resolution 88-1 – voter-approved commitment that protected far more acres of open space than what is now proposed to be preserved. Save Irvine Open Space continues to believe this approach is unfair and inconsistent with what residents were promised and voted for in 1988.

Today's residents have an important responsibility: to uphold what past generations preserved for the future. We must be better than simply developing

land when it becomes convenient. Open space, once lost, is gone forever.

As we head into 2026, we have a critical and demanding year ahead. This conversation – and this fight – is far from over.

If you are able, please consider donating to support our work and subscribing for updates so you can stay informed and engaged.

Together we can ensure that all City open space approved by a vote of our citizens in 1988 remains protected, not just for today, but for generations to come.

IRVINE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE CENTER HAS CLOSED

The Irvine Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center (HHWCC) has closed due to the end of the facility lease agreement. OC Waste & Recycling was not given the option to extend the lease, as the City of Irvine has future expansion plans for the dog park.

As a result, the Irvine HHWCC has **permanently closed as of December 31, 2025.**

If you need to dispose of hazardous materials, you are now required to drive to one of their other three centers in Anaheim, Huntington Beach, or San Juan Capistrano. All facilities are open Tuesday through Saturday, 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Everyone has hazardous waste, and it seems unlikely residents will drive up to 20 miles and spend up to \$2-\$4 in gas just to properly dispose of such items.

Please contact Irvine City Council if you would like the city to find another location in Irvine to dispose of hazardous waste.



Patriots and Paws is a Southern California veterans' organization which provides practical home goods and furnishings to Veterans, Active Duty, and Reservists at no cost with their Provision for Patriots Program. All provided at no cost. Find them on the web at <https://patriotsandpaws.org/>.

Home Depot offers a variety of programs and discounts for veterans, including a 10% military discount on most items and tax-free shopping options to all active duty, retired and veteran members of the U.S. Armed Forces, as well as their immediate families. Acceptable forms of proof include a U.S. military ID, VA-issued ID, or discharge papers.

The discount is applicable on Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, and Veterans Day, and can be used on eligible items, excluding sales tax and other fees. Veterans must show proof of military service at the time of purchase, either in-store or online.

The tax-free shopping benefit is available to all verified active-duty service members, dependents, retirees, National Guard members, Reservists, Coast Guard members, and honorably discharged veterans and their dependents.

Home Depot also offers labor, parts and general services for veterans' home repairs. If you would like to take advantage of this service, go to your local Home Depot with military I.D. and speak with a manager.

CARS SHOULD NOT BLOCK SIDEWALKS AND CROSSWALKS

Just a friendly reminder, it is illegal for vehicles to block crosswalks and sidewalks, according to both California statute and Irvine Municipal Code. Besides being illegal, it is also discourteous to pedestrians who are trying to cross the street or simply walking on the sidewalk.

Be a good neighbor and consider others, particularly people in wheelchairs or people pushing strollers or pulling wagons.



CALIFORNIA STATE LAW

Under **California Vehicle Code § 22500(f):**

A person shall not stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle on a portion of a sidewalk, or with the body of the vehicle extending over a portion of a sidewalk.

Exception: Only certain devices like mirrors or lights may extend up to 10 inches over the sidewalk.

This means **any part of the car (tires, bumper, etc.) blocking the sidewalk is illegal**, even if the car is in your driveway.

IRVINE MUNICIPAL ENFORCEMENT

The **Irvine Police Department** explicitly states: *Vehicles cannot block a public sidewalk, including the portion in front of their home. There is no exception for homes with short driveways. Sidewalks must remain clear for pedestrians, strollers, and wheelchairs.*

Violations can be reported and may result in citations.
